1 Enhanced Counter Narcotics: Costa Rica/Panama. On 10 Sep, a USN P-8 detected a Go-Fast 100 NM SE of the Costa Rica/Panama border. USCGC DAUNTLESS vectored for intercept, seizing 755.6 kg of heroin and detaining 3x Colombians. Additionally, on 11 Sep, a Contractor owned/operated Dash-8 detected a fishing vessel 250 NM S of the Costa Rica/Panama border. USCGC ESCANABA was vectored to intercept, recovering 639 kg of cocaine and detaining 3x Costa Ricans.

2 Colombia. On 11 Sep, a Dutch DH-8 detected a Go-Fast (G/F) vessel 220 NM northeast of Barranquilla, Columbia. HNLMS GRONINGEN vectored for intercept, seizing 465 kg of cocaine and 3x Dominicans.

USSTRATCOM Press Briefing. (U) Adm. Charles "Chas" Richard, commander, USSTRATCOM, provided an update on the command's mission and readiness during the COVID-19 pandemic. Questions focused on bomber task force missions, deployment of the W76-2 low yield nuclear warhead, deterring threats from China and Russia, Ground Based Strategic Deterrent contract, and the Pentagon's Unidentified Aerial Phenomenon Task Force.

RUS. (U) BLR President Lukashenko's meeting with RUS President Putin featured predominantly in the IE during the past reporting period. BLR opposition leader Tikhonovskaya declared that she reserves the right to negate any deal resulting from this meeting if and when she becomes president. Putin opposition leader Navalny was taken off artificial respiration as his condition continued to improve from the poisoning attack, and his party won rare victories in city council votes in Siberia over the weekend.

(U) Global Integration Timeline: 90 Day OAI Outlook

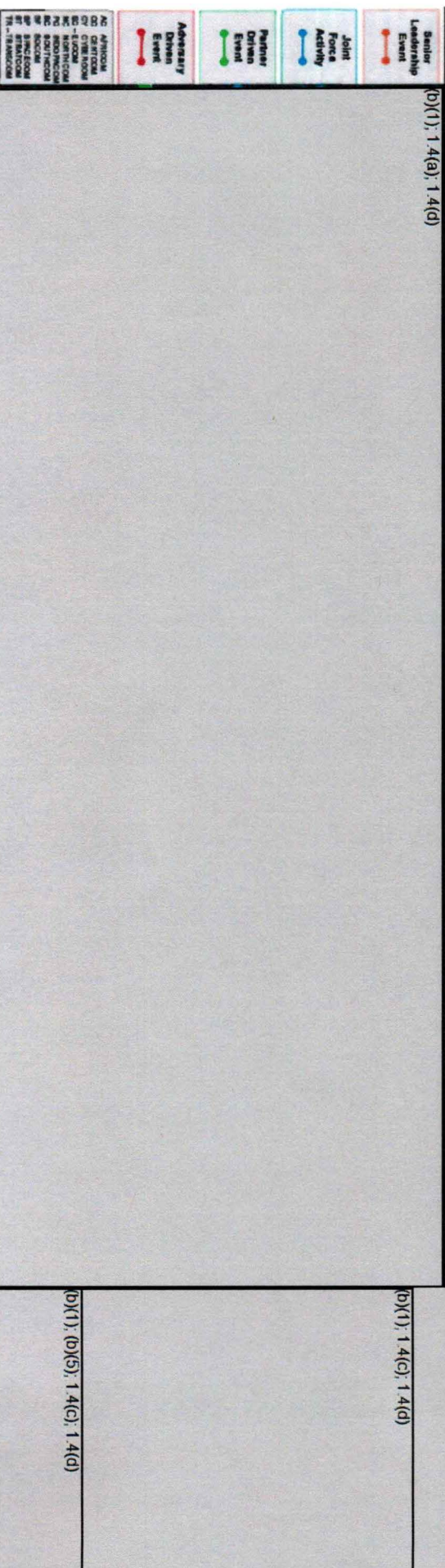

Operations (J3) (b)(1); 1.4(a) 5 Colombia. (U//FOUO) On 22 Feb, a USN P-8 detected a Go-Fast Vessel (GFV) 135 NM SW of the PANCOL border. USCGC MUNRO was intercepted the GFV. The operation resulted in the seizure of 3,640 lbs of marijuana and 3x personnel detained. Next 72 hours.	(b)(1); 1.4(a)	Intelligence (J2) ◆ Burma. (U//FOUO) On 25 Feb, demonstrations throughout Burma continued for the 20th straight day, numbering approximately 15,000 protesters across several sites. Multiple reports indicated Civil Disobedience Movement (CDM) demonstrators were met with violence instigated by pro-military protesters. Protests reportedly planned for 26 and 28 Feb, and 1 Mar, are alleged to be "larger demonstrations"; no further information. There are no known threats aimed at U.S. interests. U.S. Embassy Rangoon is working to confirm future protests, and identify potential impacts to operations and the 28 Feb charter flight to the U.S. for Chief of Mission personnel and American citizens. AMEMBASSY Rangoon Comment: 115 U.S. citizens expressed interest; although, a lower number is expected to travel. (State)

Reporter asked how the Deputy Secretary identified the key areas to review and for a copy of the memo. PA provided that the directive is an internal planning document and not intended for public release. American Airlines (AA) Incident. Multiple reporters asked about reports that a "cruise-missile-type object" passed near an AA flight over New Mexico. For reporters who asked whether the object was a U.S. military missile, PA stated that the military was not conducting any testing in that area, at that time. Reporters who asked in general about the incident, or whether DoD was investigating the "UFO" or Unidentified Aerial Phenomenon (UAP), were referred to AA or the FBI, per coordination with the FBI National Office, who first alerted PA to the incident.	Ops in Info Environment (J3) LTIOV: 251530FEB21 VEO. (U//FOUO) Tri-border insecurity continues in the Mali-Niger-Burkina Faso region, with two Malian soldiers being killed by an IED on 14 Feb. The multiple armed groups that appeared in central Mali in 2015 have thrived on the old antagonisms linked to land disputes and ethnic groups, and attack any remaining symbols of state representation to foment tension. Separately, Iraqi sources reported that a contracted U.S. military logistics convoy was targeted in Babylon on 25 Feb. In recent months, convoys carrying logistics equipment for U.S. troops stationed at Iraqi military bases have been targeted by roadside IEDs. No group has claimed responsibility for the attack at this time. (U) Top US commander warns of the rebirth of ISIS, Russian and Chinese adventurism, Taliban violence, and the ticking time bomb of refugee and prison camps. General McKenzie remarked upon the resurgence of ISIS that despite its "territorial defeat," ISIS remains "a learning and adaptable" extremist organization and is far from defeated. (U) IE Assessment

(U) The IAEA and Iranian officials reached an agreement that will extend its nuclear monitoring until 24 Jun. While the two sides reached an extension, the head of the UN's nuclear inspectorate disclosed that Iran's failure to provide credible explanations for traces of uranium found at two undeclared sites is "a big problem" that is affecting the country's credibility, as it goes through its fifth round of negotiations in Vienna.

(U) Iran and the signatories of JCPOA continued talks to reach a nuclear agreement in Vienna, which Iranian officials said will not impede upon its electoral process. The Iranian Interior Ministry named the final candidates approved for the 18 June presidential elections by the Guardian Council, with several prominent reformist and pragmatist excluded from the list. The disqualification of key presidential hopefuls triggered harsh reactions in Iran, with the current President writing Ayatollah Khamenei to express his grievances about the disqualification of certain presidential hopefuls — including his Vice President Es'haq Jahangiri. The Guardian Council's decision seems to solidify conservative Ebrahim Raisi's position as the top presidential candidate, which is projected to have an effect on the JCPOA negotiations if a deal is not reached beforehand.
